This year promises to have some of the best action ever as we have garnered interest from the AMA VP for Southern California who is bringing us a Drone Racing demonstration and FPV (first person view) technology. I recently watched one of these demonstrations and I was amazed what is available out there. We need to face it, aviation as we know it is going to change even more. 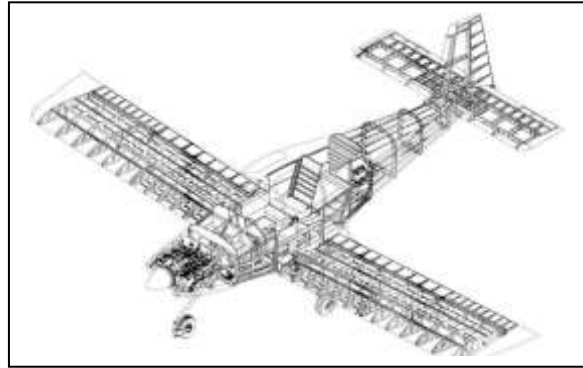
